

## **Senior Trip 2017**

### **April 21 – April 23, 2017**

**BE SURE YOUR EMERGENCY MEDICAL FORM AND CODE OF CONDUCT FORM HAVE BEEN TURNED IN,  
YOU CANNOT GO ON THE TRIP WITHOUT IT!!**

The bus will leave no later than 6:00 am. Be on the bus, not in the halls, at the Inland or still at home. **BE ON TIME!** Be in the cafeteria at 5:15 am for luggage check. **Everything** (i.e. luggage, toiletry cases, backpacks, purses, etc.) must be checked by a sponsor or administrator. We will NOT be responsible for repair or replacement of expensive items.

No eating or drinking on the buses!!! This is a rule of the bus company! We are going on charter buses, and the senior class does not have money to pay for damages. We will make one restroom stop on the way down.

When packing for the trip, remember there will be limited space for storing luggage. If your luggage consists of several pieces you may have to hold some of them ALL THE WAY DOWN and BACK!!! You may want to get together with others whom you are rooming with and decide who will bring curling iron, a blow dryer, etc.

When you arrive at the hotel, it is important for you to check the room for damages. If you find any damages, **report it to a sponsor immediately** because you will be held responsible for the damage at checkout if unreported!

#### **DRESS FOR THE TRIP**

**Friday:** We will go directly to **Sea World's Aquatica water park**. There are lockers and dressing rooms for you to change into your bathing suit once we arrive. Appropriate dress: Bathing suit, cover up, shorts (NO SHORT SHORTS), shirt (NO INAPPROPRIATE WRITING), etc. Shoes ARE required and, don't forget to bring (and apply) SUNSCREEN & a TOWEL!

**Friday Evening:** We will be going to Golden Corral for dinner and then straight to **Universal Studios Grad Bash**. They have a VERY strict dress code and will be enforced by their officials so please abide by the dress code which is attached. **READ IT CAREFULLY.** If you must take a prescription drug during Grad Bash, you need to see Mrs. Solburg as soon as possible as we will need to let Universal know before-hand.

**Saturday:** We will have continental breakfast at the hotel before heading to **Disney's Hollywood Studios**. Appropriate dress: shorts (NO SHORT SHORTS), shirt (NO INAPPROPRIATE WRITING), etc. Shoes should be comfortable; we will be doing a lot of walking! Bring SUNSCREEN!

**Saturday Evening:** We will be going to **Disney Springs** for dinner and a show at **La Nouba**. You will be given money to buy dinner at the place of your choice. There are LOTS of places to choose from! If you want to dine at a table-service restaurant, make sure to take into account how busy the restaurant may be and how long you may have to wait for a table. You may want to make reservations in advance. After dinner, you will be able to explore Disney Springs for a little while until we get seated for La Nouba. Appropriate dress for guys: Jeans or Khakis, collared shirt, and light weight jacket or sweater. Appropriate dress for ladies: jeans, slacks, dress or skirts; NO REVEALING TOPS.

**Sunday:** We will have continental breakfast at the hotel before heading home. Dress comfortably.

#### **REMINDERS AND SUGGESTIONS**

- **Be on time for all activities.** Check your itinerary often for times! We will have a great time if everyone is considerate of each other and cooperative.
- There are lots of security and police officers at all of the parks, both with uniforms on and some dressed like you. Beware because they are watching everything you do. They will not hesitate to take you into custody if you are doing something you shouldn't be doing.
- Take advantage of sleep time—you won't get much! Don't rely on "5-hour energy"...they can make you very ill!
- Stay hydrated! You need plenty of water spending so much time on the go in the heat.

### **HELPFUL INFORMATION:**

Cell phones are permitted on this trip but you must keep up with them – we will not be held responsible for their loss. We will need to be able to communicate during the trip, so we will use a texting app called Remind.com. Some of you may be familiar with this app. All you have to do is text **@wakulla17 to 81010** in order to join the group. You will be prompted to send your name and from there, you will be able to text Mrs. Solburg if needed.

Break in new shoes – blisters can make your trip miserable! Bring Band-Aids just in case.

Sunscreen is a necessity for Hollywood Studios and Aquatica waterpark– sunburns can also make your trip miserable.

**You will be expected to abide by school rules since this is a school-sponsored activity. Any student who does not abide by these rules will be sent home at their own expense and may additionally be assigned In School Suspension during the last week of school.**

# DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

Universal's Grad Bash is a once-a-year school event requiring enforcement of a dress code to ensure proper dress/attire for students and chaperones. All outfits must remain intact for the entire Universal's Grad Bash event and any Pre-Parties. We thank you in advance for your cooperation with our dress code.



## GIRLS

- ▼ Dresses, skirts, capris or Bermuda shorts, no shorter than mid-thigh
- ▼ Casual pants (including jeans)
- ▼ Casual blouses and tops with sleeves at least three inches wide
- ▼ Comfortable shoes (including tennis shoes, dress sandals, boots and flip-flops)
- ▼ Purses no larger than 8.5" x 5.5" (size of a half sheet of paper)
- ▼ Cameras and cell phones

## GUYS

- ▼ Casual pants or shorts (including khakis and jeans), secured at waist
- ▼ Shirts with sleeves (golf/polo, dress and T-shirts with sleeves), sport jackets and dress suits
- ▼ Comfortable shoes (including tennis shoes, dress shoes, boots and flip-flops)
- ▼ Cameras and cell phones

**PLEASE NOTE:** The school is responsible for enforcing the dress code prior to arrival at the event.



## UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE\*

- ▼ Clothing affiliated with any school, sports team, group, club, etc. (ex: letterman jackets, clothing with school logos, etc.)
- ▼ Gang paraphernalia, jewelry, tattoos, clothing or other insignias of any kind
- ▼ Clothing or accessories with area codes
- ▼ Visible undergarments
- ▼ Clothing with visible tears, holes, and shredding
- ▼ Belts, wallet chains, or jewelry of any kind containing spikes
- ▼ Extremely revealing clothing including: bathing suit tops, bottoms, or see-through clothing of any kind
- ▼ Any clothing deemed inappropriate at a school function
- ▼ Guys may not wear tank tops or undershirts
- ▼ Clothing with language or graphics that are obscene, offensive or suggestive of sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related messaging
- ▼ Hats and other head attire
- ▼ All backpacks, briefcases, hip packs, camera bags, tote bags, and oversized purses larger than 8.5" x 11"
- ▼ Weapons, knives, laser pointers, and chemical irritants of any kind
- ▼ Over-the-counter medications; tobacco or tobacco related products such as lighters, matches, pipes, etc.; and alcohol or any controlled substance
- ▼ Any containers with fluids of any kind; this includes water, any drinks and perfumes
- ▼ Aerosol cans/bottles of any type
- ▼ Guys and Girls may not wear Basketball Shorts of any kind
- ▼ Girls may not wear tube tops, tube top dresses, one-shoulder shirts or any off the shoulder dresses of any kind
